Please review with your children that it is important to dress appropriately for the weather as it can be chilly on occasion in the mornings. Thanksgiving is right around the corner and we hope that you will be able to get together with family and enjoy the weather together.

Thank you to all of you who were able to join us for our Open House this year. The hard work by our parent council, and staff made it a positive experience for everyone. Getting together with everyone and celebrating all the positive things that are happening at the school is always time well spent. It was great to have the architect here to show us the designs for the new school. We are looking forward to being able to make the move in December.

Our professional development days have been well spent. We reviewed our EQAO results and from looking at this data as well as the learning styles of the children in each classroom we are working together as a staff to develop lessons and units to address the individual needs of every student. The use of what is called *Adifferentiated instruction* means that we will learn about how your child learns best, give each child the opportunity to learn in the best way for them and use assessment to determine where we need to begin each child's instruction. We looked at our long range planning model and also learned about how to engage our students as we focus on problem solving in math.

All staff are committed to developing their program so that every student can be successful and learn in a manner that is supportive of their learning needs. It is time of optimism and excitement at the school as we delve into another year of new learning.

### Recess & Weather

### New Student Drop off Location

To assist with the flow of traffic around the school in the morning, we will have created a student drop off location at the front east side of the school. Please use the circle driveway off Ermatinger Street. A staff member will be on duty each morning to supervise and assist students. If parents and guardians need to park when you are dropping off or picking up your child or children, please park on the side streets surrounding the school. Our school parking lots have limited parking and Ermatinger and Edward streets has limited parking due to bus loading and no parking or stopping areas.

## Shoes
