From Principal Ms. Hope

At the beginning of November the weather has changed and we are seeing the rain, wind and leaves flying around which signifies a time change and darker mornings. With the later sunrise and earlier dusk we are asking parents to remind their children to dress warmly and for the weather. Try and put a flash of colour on dark coats to help people more easily see the students on the roads and sidewalks.

November 11<sup>th</sup> is Remembrance Day where we take time to formally recognize the contributions of our families and the sacrifices that have been and continue to be made in many different conflicts. From peacekeeping missions to serving on the front lines in times of war many of the men and women from Canada have served in order to support the freedoms that we have and that other should have. Canada's First Nation, Metis and Inuit people have always been actively involved as members of this country's armed forces. During our school assembly on November 10th @ 9 am we are hoping to have veterans or currently serving members of the forces from all backgrounds join us to honour those who have served.

November is Indigenous Awareness Month where we all learn together about the shared history that exists among the First Nation, Metis and Inuit people who were on this land long before the rest of us. During this month we are focusing on learning about our common history, the treaties that have existed throughout history and those that exist today. We are all treaty people as we are all represented in some manner in these agreements.

At our school we have many students who are from Curve Lake First Nation as well as other homes who self-identify as belonging to an Indigenous group. We are very lucky as a community to be able to come together and learn both about and from one another. We will be focusing on our history and the contributions made by First Nation people to science, culture, inventions and medicine (among other things) and the partnerships that existed that helped to shape our country as it exists today. Being a tri-lingual school we are able to make many connections among FNMI, French and English cultures and their histories.

We will be sending information home so you can have conversations with your children about the learning that is happening not only in November, but through the year.

### **New Student Drop off Location**

### Going Out For Lunch



#### Shoes

If possible, each child should have an outdoor pair of shoes and an indoor pair of shoes. For Physical Education classes, students need rubber soled shoes that do not mark the floors, (not dark soles)

#### City Residents

If you live within the Peterborough / Lakefield City Limits you must pick up a police check request sheet from the school office and take this form with two pieces of Identification to the local police station in Lakefield. The cost is \$6.34.

#### **County Residents**

If you live in the OPP area you need to pick up the paper work at the school office and take it to the OPP station in Peterborough. You must bring two pieces of Identification.

#### **Curve Lake Residents**

Curve Lake volunteers will need to pick up a police check request sheet from the school office and take this form along with two pieces of identifications to the Curve Lake Police Station.

Our school hallways are very busy during the arrival and departure times, especially during the winter months with winter clothing. For this reason and for security reasons, we ask that parent/guardians drop off and/or pick up students outside the exit doors. If you need to speak to a teacher, please call and arrange an appointment or write a note for the teacher to give you a call. Your cooperation and support with this issue is greatly appreciated.

Please communicate any changes of your child's regular routine in their agenda or communication book. We need these changes in writing. Calling the office at the end of the day may not ensure your plans are carried out.

If you meet your child at the end of the day you are encouraged to meet in the front lobby. Please remember to sign your child in at the office if he or she is late and sign when picking up early.

### **November 5-11 is Treaty Recognition Week in Ontario**

Treaties Recognition Week is a time to learn about the importance of treaties in Ontario.

Ontario is covered by 46 treaties and other agreements, such as land purchases by the Crown. These agreements were signed between 1781 and 1930.

Schools within the Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board sit on land within the Williams Treaties of 1923, signed with the Mississauga and Chippewa Nations. The Williams Treaties First Nations include the Mississaugas of Alderville First Nation, Curve Lake First Nation, and Hiawatha First Nation, as well as other neighbouring First Nations.

Treaties helped to establish relationships between First Nations and Europeans, and between people and the land.

Friday November 10<sup>th</sup> is the day for our annual Remembrance Day Assembly. This year, we are bursting at the seams and space is at a premium so we will be holding two Assemblies on this day. The Junior/Intermediate classes (Gooley, Fenn, Adamson, Breau, Laperle, DesJardins, Darling, Darling, Desbiens, Parson, Caldwell, Greer) will gather in the gym at 9 am. The Legion colour guard and veterans will be piped in at 9:15. We expect this assembly to be finished around 10:30. The second assembly for the Primary classes (Schultz, Metcalfe, Irwin, French, Vallillee, Hibbs, Willshaw, Gusso, Martin, Keitel, Peterzen) will be after the first recess at 11:35. During this assembly students will have the chance to ask the veterans questions and listen to their stories. We will also host a reception for the veterans between the two assemblies.

Traditionally, we have always welcomed parents to attend the assembly with us if they wish and any veterans in your family who are able to are welcome to attend and be piped in by our piper and sit with the veterans if they wish (or remain with their family if they are more comfortable with that). This year however, because of the space issue, we need to ask that parents and veterans attending either (or both) of our assemblies need to RRSP with the office so that we know how many chairs to put out and how much space to leave for our guests.

All students will be given a poppy on the morning of the assembly which we traditionally leave on the display in the front foyer on our way out of the assembly. In the afternoon, poppies will be returned to students to take home so that they have a poppy to wear on Nov. 11<sup>th</sup>. If students wear their own special poppy to school that day, they can keep that poppy on and place the one the school gives them on the table.

We sincerely hope to see many of our students and parents at the Remembrance Day observances on Saturday Nov. 11<sup>th</sup> in all our LDPS communities. The students have been learning about the importance of dedication to the community and service at home and around the world. They have many questions that they will want to share with you about their own family history of service and what it means to us in our daily lives. Our school will be presenting a wreath at the Lakefield Cenotaph on Nov. 11th.

A letter has gone home to youngest and only students asking if there are any veterans that have not been added to our map we keep of all LDPS related veterans and where they served. If you would like your family veteran(s) added to our map, please send the letter back with the name of the veteran as well as one place where they served. We will add them to the map in time for Friday's assembly.


